
The response will be contraction of biceps with or without flexion of elbow.

The Triceps reflex: (C6 C8):


Patient's arm flexed at 90 degrees at elbow.

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b. Two points discrimination: It is tested by using two pins or the two limbs of a blunt compass needle. Two points can usually be distinguished from one when they are 0.3-0.5 cm apart on the fingertip, 1 cm finge Tm gs4.09(m)18()]TJETBT1



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
